



Preventing and managing allergies can make a whole company feel better.

Allergies are one of the most common health conditions, affecting 1 in 5 Americans. They account for more than 17 million physician office visits, 30,000 emergency room visits and several hundred deaths each year.¹

And they can make your bottom line less than healthy, too. On average, people with allergies miss 1.7 workdays per year due to allergies and experience symptoms for an average of 69 days (nearly 10 weeks) annually.

In the U.S., allergies are a major cause of work absenteeism and "presenteeism" (when workers show up for work, but are less productive), resulting in nearly 4 million missed or lost workdays each year and over \$700 million in lost productivity.¹

You can do something to alleviate the effects of allergies in the workplace by making your employees aware of triggers, treatments and management tactics. Your Allergy Health Kit can help you put an awareness program into place.

It's important — but you can make it fun! And with the program's simple structure, it's easy to execute, so you won't feel any side effects in your busy day.

What's in your Allergy Health Kit?

This kit contains links to materials you can simply download and distribute. It also includes a detailed guide for creating an *Allergy Awareness Challenge* in your workplace, with educational tools for learning more about controlling allergies.

A few points to remember:

- *Keep it simple.* All of the tools in this kit are meant to help you and require very little time for you to manage.
- Spread it out. Don't distribute every email and flyer to employees at once. Stagger your messaging over several weeks or a month. You might even want to declare an "Allergy Awareness Month" at your company.
- *Keep it fun.* Employees really want to enjoy being healthy. So present this program as a positive, helpful experience, not a mandatory requirement. Because this program is meant to help, not overwhelm.



When it comes to allergies, knowledge is powerful medicine. By understanding what triggers allergies and how to treat them, employees can take steps to manage their health. That's what an *Allergy Awareness Challenge* is all about. Use these tools to put it in place!
